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



## What is DACA?

DACA is a legal tool that allows USCIS to defer the removal of young undocumented immigrants

#### Who are the *Dreamers?*

- Dreamers are undocumented immigrants who were brought into the United States at a young age
- Dreamers grew up in America
- For many **Dreamers**, the U.S. is the **only country they have ever** called home



 Dreamers are our neighbors, co-workers, students and community and church leaders



## What is the **Purpose** of DACA?

 To defer the removal of eligible dreamers of good moral character lacking intent to violate immigration law when entering the U.S.

 To conserve immigration enforcement resources for high-priority cases

## **DACA** is Discretionary

 Granted at the discretion of USCIS on a case-bycase basis



- Available only to eligible dreamers who meet specific eligibility criteria
- Renewable in two-year increments



## **DACA Eligibility Criteria**

- Must have been present in the U.S. on June 15, 2012
- ✓ Must have resided continuously in the U.S. for a minimum of 5 years (since June 15, 2007)

- ✓ Must have been younger than 30 on June 15, 2012 (Born on June 16, 1982 or later)
- Must have arrived in the U.S. before age 16

## Eligibility Criteria, continued

- Academic requirement
- Good moral character requirement





#### **DACA Benefits**

- Prevents young immigrants from being placed in removal proceedings
- Provides temporary relief to eligible immigrants who are currently in removal proceedings or subject to final orders of removal
- ✓ Provides temporary employment authorization for eligible immigrants, who can demonstrate economic necessity. This allows the issuance of a valid Social Security card.







#### **DACA Does Not Include**

- **✗** Does not provide Permanent Residence
- ✗ Does not lead to U.S. citizenship
- ✗ Does not provide a path to Permanent Residence or U.S. citizenship

## 2014 Executive Actions on Immigration

On November 20, 2014, President Obama announced the following executive actions on immigration:

Expanding DACA to include individuals of any current age, who entered the U.S. before the age of 16 (Expanded DACA)



+ Allowing parents of U.S. citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents to apply for deferred action and employment authorization (DAPA)

## Legal Challenges to Expanded DACA and DAPA

• On December 2, 2014, in Texas et al. v. United States, 25 states filed suit challenging President Obama's executive actions.





- On February 16, 2015, Judge Andrew Hanen of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Texas issued a preliminary injunction on Expanded DACA and DAPA.
- On November 9, 2015, a three-member panel of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit affirmed the district court's preliminary injunction.




## **U.S. Supreme Court** Decision

During his campaign, Candidate Trump promised to end DACA on his first day in office.

During a press conference at the White House in February 2017, President Trump vowed to "show great heart" in his DACA policy.



President Trump said DACA recipients can "rest easy" because federal agencies are "not [going] after the Dreamers."

#### **Removal Enforcement Priorities**

#### January 25, 2017

#### Trump's Priorities are undocumented aliens:

- (a) Convicted of **any criminal offense**
- (b) Charged with any criminal offense
- (c) Who have committed acts that constitute a chargeable criminal offense
- (d) Who have abused any public benefit program
- (e) Who pose a risk to public safety or national security

#### November 20, 2014

Obama Priority 1 - Threats to National Security, Border Security, and Public Safety, including aliens:

- (a) Engaged in or suspected of terrorism or espionage
- (b) Apprehended at the border
- (c) With participation in a criminal street gang
- (d) Convicted of a felony offense
- (e) Convicted of an "aggravated felony"

Obama Priority 2 - Misdemeanors and Immigration Violations, including aliens:

- (a) Convicted of three or more misdemeanor offenses
- (b) Convicted of a "significant misdemeanor"
- (c) Who cannot establish that they have been **physically present in the country since January 1, 2014**
- (d) Who have abused visa or visa waiver programs

#### Obama Priority 3 - Other Immigration Violations

(a) Aliens issued **final orders of removal,** after January 1, 2014

## **Recent Challenges to DACA**

 On June 29, 2017, 10 Republican attorney generals, led by Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton, sent a letter to U.S. Attorney General Jeff Sessions urging him to end DACA, and threatening a lawsuit.

"[W]e request that the Secretary of Homeland Security rescind the June 15, 2012 DACA memorandum and order that the Executive Branch will not renew or issue any new DACA or Expanded DACA permits in the future."





#### **The Threat:**


"If, by September 5, 2017, the Executive Branch agrees to rescind the June 15, 2012 DACA memorandum and not to renew or issue any new DACA or Expanded DACA permits in the future, then the plaintiffs that successfully challenged DAPA and Expanded DACA will voluntarily dismiss their lawsuit currently pending in the Southern District of Texas."

"Otherwise, the complaint in that case will be amended to challenge both the DACA program and the remaining Expanded DACA permits."

#### In Support of DACA:



On July 21, 2017, 20 attorney generals, led by California Attorney General Xavier Becerra, wrote a letter to President Donald Trump, in support of DACA.



"Mr. President, now is the time to affirm the commitment you made, both to the 'incredible kids' who benefit from DACA and to their families and our communities, to handle this issue 'with heart.' You said Dreamers should 'rest easy.' We urge you to affirm America's values and tradition as a nation of immigrants and make clear that you will not only continue DACA, but that you will defend it. The cost of not doing so would be too high for America, the economy, and for these young people. For these reasons, we urge to maintain and defend DACA, and we stand in support of the effort to defend DACA by all appropriate means."

### **Upcoming Legal Battle**



If the lawsuit moves forward, the case would be heard by U.S. District Judge Andrew Hanen for the Southern District of Texas.



 On July 12, 2017, then DHS Secretary John Kelly told members of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus that while he supports DACA, he does not believe that it would survive a legal challenge.

## What is next for DACA? Dream Act of 2017

 Initially introduced in the Senate on August 1, 2001, by Senators Dick Durbin (D-Illinois) and Orrin Hatch (R-Utah)





 Sought to provide a path to Permanent Residence for qualifying immigrants between the ages of 12 and 35 at the time of enactment



 Variations of the DREAM Act have since been reintroduced at least 10 times without success

## The Dream Act of 2017


• Introduced on July 20, 2017, by Senators Lindsey Graham (R-South Carolina) and Dick Durbin (D-Illinois)

- Would provide a path to lawful permanent residence for immigrants who:
- Have been continuously present in the U.S, for four years preceding the date of enactment
- Were 17 years old or younger on the initial date of entry into the U.S.
- Are not inadmissible to the U.S. on grounds of terrorism, smuggling, student visa abuse, polygamy, unlawful voting, or child abduction
- Meet the academic and good moral character requirements of DACA



- Under the Dream Act of 2017, the Secretary of Homeland Security would be directed to cancel removal and grant conditional permanent resident status to any person who has been granted DACA, unless that person has engaged in conduct that would make him or her ineligible for DACA.
- Conditional permanent resident status is valid for 8 years, and can be made permanent after that period.


